Angle, Paul M. & Miers, Earl Schenck, editors. FIRE THE SALUTE! ABE LINCOLN IS NOMINATED: Murat Halstead Reports The Republican National Convention in Chicago, May 16, 17, & 18, 1860. Kingsport, TN: Kingsport Press, 1960. Limited edition of 1,250 copies, 68(i)p., frontispiece, illustration. Halstead was still comparatively young, but was rising in journalism when he traveled the nation covering the crisis that led to the Civil War. His coverage of the Republican Convention in Chicago for the Cincinnati Commercial became the most reliable and most thrilling account of Abraham Lincoln's nomination. Paul Angle and Earl Schenck Miers re-published Halstead's writing in 1960 with new introduction and scholarly annotations for the centennial commemoration. This sharp-looking limited edition features a color frontispiece of Thomas Hicks' life oil painting of the candidate from June of 1860 and an uncommon and vivid color representation of the Wigwam convention building. This groundbreaking study examines the myriad events that culminated in the bloody fighting at Bentonville between the armies of William T. Sherman and Joseph E. Johnston. Bradley

has amassed an exhaustive array of sources - many previously unpublished - to chronicle the evolution of the Confederacy's last vigorous effort to halt Sherman's thrust through the Carolinas. Included are detailed accounts of the bitter fighting at Monroe's Crossroads and Averasboro, biographical sketches of leading participants, and 15 original campaign and tactical maps. 

The first fully illustrated book in thirty years to examine all the U.S. Presidents, and the companion book to the PBS series. The authors of LINCOLN: AN ILLUSTRATED BIOGRAPHY and (Philip Jr.) TWENTY DAYS, arrange their chapters thematically rather than chronologically, juxtaposing the careers of four presidents who may have lived in different centuries or held different political beliefs, but who nevertheless share a defining aspect of what our country looks for in its leaders. McPherson, James M. CROSSROADS OF FREEDOM: ANTIETAM 1862. Oxford: 2002. Limited edition #139/1,000, 203p., illustrations, maps. James McPherson paints a masterful account of this pivotal battle, the events that led up to it, and its aftermath. As McPherson shows, by September 1862 the survival of the United States was in doubt. The union had suffered a string of defeats, and Lee's army was in Maryland, poised to threaten Washington. The British government was openly talking of recognizing the Confederacy and brokering a peace between North and South. Northern armies and voters were demoralized. And Lincoln had shelved his proposed edict of emancipation months before, waiting for a victory that had not come. Both sides knew that they were marching toward a decisive battle. It came along the ridges and in the woods and cornfields between Antietam Creek and the Potomac River. Valor, misjudgment, and astonishing coincidence all played a role in the outcome. McPherson vividly describes a day of savage fighting in locales that became forever famous - the Cornfield, the Dunkard Church, the West Woods, and Bloody Lane. Lee's battered army escaped to fight another day, but Antietam was a critical victory for the Union. McPherson brilliantly weaves these strands of diplomatic, political and military history into a compact, swift-moving narrative that shows why America's bloodiest day is, indeed, a crossroads. 
Confederacy. Although Gen. Braxton Bragg's Confederates won the day, Bragg soon retreated in the face of Gen. Don Carlos Buell's overwhelming numbers. "Kenneth W. Rable, George C. FREDERICKSBURG! FREDERICKSBURG! Chapel Hill: University of North Carolina Press, 2002. 1st edition, 671p., illustrations, maps. During the battle of Gettysburg, as Union troops along Cemetery Ridge rebuffed Pickett's Charge, they were heard to shout, "Give them Fredericksburg!" Their cries reverberated from a clash that, although fought some six months earlier, clearly loomed large in the minds of Civil War soldiers. Fought on December 13, 1862, Fredericksburg ended in a stunning defeat for the Union. Lee suffered roughly 5,000 casualties but inflicted more than twice that many losses (nearly 13,000) on his opponent, General Ambrose Burnside. As news of the Union loss traveled north, it spread a wave of public despair that extended all the way to Lincoln. In the beleaguered Confederacy, the southern victory bolstered flagging hopes, as Lee and his men began to take on an aura of invincibility. Rable offers a gripping account of the battle and places the campaign within its broader political, social, and military context, blending battlefield and home front history and addressing questions of strategy, tactics, and the rhythms and disruptions of military life.
